



## Alleyne Faries Stewart

May 26, 1921 - January 5, 2018

Alleyne Faries Stewart was born on May 26, 1921 in Longview, Texas, the daughter of Allen Knight Faries and Mattye Lee (Gates) Faries. She graduated from Longview High School. Alleyne was united in marriage to Barnard Stewart at Alpine Methodist Church in Longview. She owned and operated Stewart's Grocery Store in Longview for many years and also assisted Barnard with their crop dusting business. Alleyne was a member of the Eastern Star, the Women's Cattleman's Association, the Giddings Garden Club and was a longtime volunteer with Rejuvenation in Giddings. She enjoyed gardening and crocheting. She had crocheted over 100 children's blankets for the young patients at MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston as well as countless other blankets and afghans for family members and friends.

Alleyne passed away during the early morning hours of Friday, January 5, 2018 at St. Mark's Medical Center in La Grange.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Allen & Mattye Faries; her husband, Barnard Stewart and two brothers, Leon Faries and Floron Faries.
