



Alvin Albert Beisert

June 2, 1931 - April 21, 2025

Funeral services for Alvin Beisert, 93 of Giddings, will be held at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday, April 27, 2025 at Christ Lutheran Church in Loebau, Texas with Rev. Dale Bohm officiating. Burial will follow in the Christ Lutheran Cemetery. Visitation will be held on Saturday, April 26, 2025 from 8:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. and on Sunday, April 27, 2025 from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. at Phillips and Luckey Funeral Home in Giddings. The family will be present for visitation Saturday evening from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m.

Oldest son of Louis and Minnie (Hohle) Beisert, Alvin was born June 2, 1931 at home in Loebau, and welcomed by a brother and six sisters and followed by five more brothers and six more sisters. Christ Lutheran Church of Loebau was the home of his faith life with his baptism June 7, 1931 by Rev. C. Durow, attended the parochial school there, confirmed April 23, 1944 by Rev. H. Hartfield, married Ruth Schulze Beisert January 13, 1952 by Rev. H. Hartfield, and his final resting place in the church cemetery where so many of his family also rest. His confirmation verse was Revelation 2:10, "Be thou faithful unto death and I will give thee a crown of life."

At an early age Alvin worked on the family farm, plowing with mules. He also worked at Mitschke's Sawmill in Loebau. He treasured special memories of time spent with his grandfather, August Beisert. He worked with his brothers in the drywall business, first in Dallas, then Houston. The brothers were all

musically talented, with Alvin on the fiddle, they performed together as a band that entertained throughout the area, playing for family get togethers, the church picnics, local dancehalls, and even the Esquire Ball Room in Houston.

He was drafted into the Marines in 1951 receiving his training in California, then stationed at Fort Lawson, Seattle, Washington, accompanied by his bride Ruth, coming home two years later with a son and another on the way. He was discharged from the Marine Reserves in 1960. The family resided in Houston, becoming members at St. Mark Lutheran. Moving to Cypress, they were members at St. John Lutheran. Alvin continued to work in the drywall business, eventually joining his brother Ruben in A&R Drywall. They returned to reside in Lee County where Alvin gradually retired and let the “boys” take charge of Alvin Beisert & Sons Drywall of Giddings. They were members at Immanuel Lutheran Church, Giddings, and then Christ Lutheran Church of Loebau. Alvin was an active leader in each church and community. He had a big heart and would put down whatever he was doing to help others. He served as an elder and held other offices in each congregation. Michael and Ronnie remember their dad serving as coach for their Little League Baseball teams and cheering them on in school athletics. He lived his faith every day and instilled that faith in his sons with daily devotions at home and regular church attendance. Every evening after supper, the boys had to recite commandments or Bible verses before they could watch tv or go out to play in the evenings.

Affectionately called “Ollie” or “Uncle Ollie” by family and friends, Alvin enjoyed farming, ranching, taking care of the garden to provide Ruth with plenty of vegetables for canning and sharing, traveling with his family, camping, and hosting events for family, friends, and employees. Who can forget the 1980 New Year’s Eve party in his red barn while he fiddled and others joined in with music, singing, and dancing! Memories include weekends spent fishing at the lake or river, or hunting camps-- always with plenty of

family and friends along. In his later years, he spent time with Ruth at home, usually watching RFD TV, or sitting on their patio visiting with family or friends that would stop by, and always ending their evening with Portals of Prayer and the Lord's Prayer. When Ruth went to the nursing home, he looked forward to going with Mike to feed and check cattle. He spent much quiet time in prayer. Grandsons Mike and Cody visited him at the nursing home on Easter Sunday, and even though he was not able to communicate with them, they will not forget that when Mollie B came on, he was tapping his foot to the polka music!!

Alvin passed away the afternoon of Monday, April 21, 2025 at Oakland Manor Nursing Center in Giddings.

He is predeceased by his wife of 73 years, Ruth (Schulze) Beisert, his parents, his brothers, many of his sisters, and in-laws, daughter-in-law, Debra Beisert, and many special friends.

Alvin is survived by two sons: Michael and Deborah Beisert, and Ronnie Beisert; grandchildren: Julie and Hoby Smith, Hutto; Michael D. A. Beisert, Buchanan Dam; Nathalie and David Arldt, Ledbetter; Cody W. and Katrina Beisert, Giddings; Jennica Beisert, Lincoln; Abigail and Colton Coates, Bay City; 17 great grandchildren; 5 great- great-grandchildren, and of the 19 siblings, he is survived by three sisters. Elna and Gene Moerbe, Gladys Iselt, and Janette Benignus, and three sisters-in-law, Alice Beisert, Bernice Beisert, and Betty Beisert.

Alvin had numerous nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.
