



Aura Sue Robinson Trotter

April 10, 1920 - November 29, 2012

Aura Sue Robinson Trotter was born April 10, 1920 in Minerva, Texas. She was the youngest of seven children of Grace and David Robinson. She raised her family and spent her first 40 adult years in Texas City, including surviving the horrendous Texas City Disaster and then hurricane Carla, where, after the death of her husband Charlie in 1962, she opened a fabric store and became a successful business owner during a time when few women assumed such roles. She then moved to Corpus Christi and enjoyed high-rise living, with a view of the bay, for about 15 years before retiring at the age of 74 to El Campo, to provide full time care for her eldest sister. That act typified Sue's entire life, she was a born caretaker. She was dedicated to the care of others; first her children, her aging mother, all of her grandchildren, her four sisters, at one time or another, and a brother. She was an exceptional seamstress, she did not sew for money, only for love, just one of the small examples of what she did for love. Sue passed away Thursday, November 29th, reaching the age of 92. She was preceded in death by her husband, Charlie Carlton Trotter; her parents, Grace and David Robinson; three sisters, Lois Robinson, Esther Mae Fuhlberg and Mary Frances Eberle; brother, David Robinson. Surviving; One son, Carl Trotter and wife Carole of Las Cruces, New Mexico. Daughters, Carolyn Trimble and husband Rodney of Chetopa, Kansas and Joyce Kaemmerling and husband Raymond of Little Rock, Arkansas. Sister, Marie Hicks of El Campo.
