A memorial service for Beverly Toth, 54, of Georgetown, Texas is scheduled for 6:00 p.m. on Saturday, February 8, 2020 at Kingdom Hall of Jehovah's Witnesses, 1701 North Austin Avenue, Georgetown, Texas with Brother Joe Strain officiating. Beverly Ann Toth was born on November 17, 1965 in Youngstown, Ohio to Robert M. and Neva M. (Gordon) Perry. She graduated from Howland High School in 1984. Bev met Joe while they both worked at a local video store chain. Eventually they began working in the corporate office and started dating. They were married on August 13, 1994 in Warren, Ohio. Bev was raised as one of the Jehovah's Witnesses and was baptized in November of 1995 at the Coraopolis, Pennsylvania Assembly Hall of Jehovah's Witnesses near Pittsburgh. After visiting family in Texas in 2009, Bev and Joe moved to Georgetown, Texas in the summer of 2010 to get away from the cold Ohio weather. She began working at the local HEB as a cashier, but moved quickly into the pharmacy. Bev was encouraged to become a pharmacy technician and passed her exam in 2016. She received the "HEB Woman of Distinction Award" while working there. Bev was very humble and never expected such an award. Many pharmacy customers would greet her when they saw her outside the store, and many still asked about her after she had stopped working due to her health.

Bev was known as a “tell it like it is” kind of person and you always knew where you stood. Not to be out done, Bev had a wonderful sense of humor and loved telling jokes. She enjoyed working in the yard and tending to her flowers. When it came to going on adventures and road trips, she was always ready to head to the beach, the zoo, or anything that involved her family. She enjoyed her recent trips to California with her son, and her girls only trip to look for diamonds in Arkansas. Her grandchildren were her greatest joy and she spent as much time with them as she could.

Bev passed away the morning of Thursday, January 30, 2020 at the Christopher House in Austin after a long fight with cancer.

She is preceded in death by her parents, Robert and Neva Perry; sister, Roberta Hileman; and brother, Wayne Perry.

Bev is survived by her husband, Joe Toth of Georgetown; daughter, Kirstin and Luke Simon of Manor; son, Jared Toth of Manor; four grandchildren, Kylee Simon, Lacey Simon, Jaxson Simon, and Parker Simon all of Manor; two sisters, Doreen and Alan Sowa of Florida, and Eileen and J.D. Blackfoot of Ohio; two brothers, Jeffrey and Cindy Perry of Ohio, and Russell Perry of Pennsylvania; one sister-in-law, Cindy Perry of Georgetown, as well as many nieces, nephews, cousins and friends.
