Billy's generous spirit, creative hands, and loving heart will be deeply missed

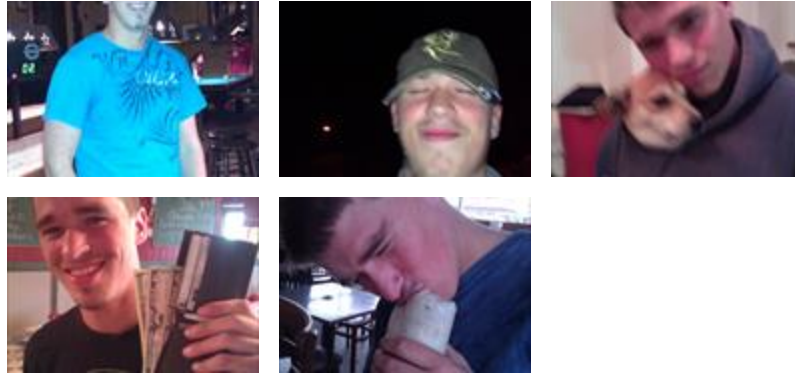

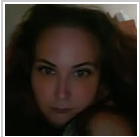
