Carl Edwin Turner, 77, passed away peacefully in Bryan, TX on Sunday, January 3, 2021. Visitation will be held Wednesday, January 6, from 5 to 7 pm at Phillips and Luckey Funeral Home. 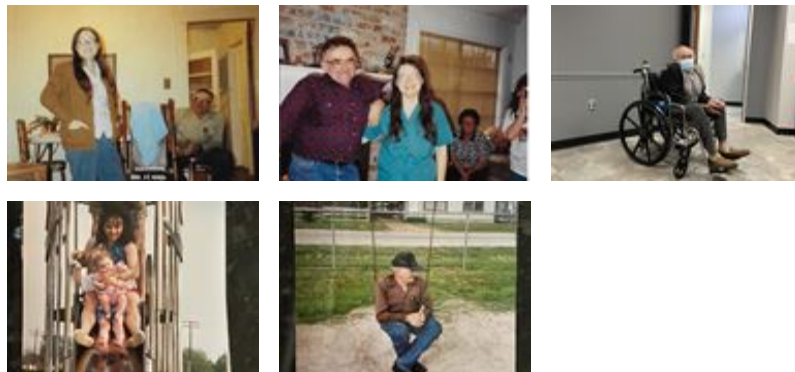
