Carolyn Marie Bohot was born on March 3, 1938 in Giddings, Texas to Carl Herman Herbert Bohot and Alma Marie (Hilsberg) Bohot. She was baptized on March 27, 1938 at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Giddings. Carolyn was confirmed on April 6, 1952 at Immanuel by Rev. Max Studtman. Her confirmation verse was John 16:23, "And in that day ye shall ask me nothing. Verily, verily, I say unto you, Whatsoever ye shall ask the Father in my name, he will give it you." She attended the University of Washington and earned a double major in English and music. While living in Washington, she played with the Belleview Civic Symphony. She worked as a legal assistant for many years. She was married to Monroe C. Miertschin on August 6, 2008 by Rev. Jeremy Walloch. Carolyn was very active in the community as she was on many quilting guilds, volunteered at the Texas Wendish Heritage Museum, served as a Stephen's Minister in the critical care unit at Seton Hospital, and was an active member at Grace Lutheran Church in Giddings. She was a long time member of the Brenham Choral. She also enjoyed researching genealogy, quilting, knitting, and crocheting, reading, and traveling. Carolyn loved cats and took care of many over the years.

Carolyn passed away the morning of Monday, July 13, 2020 in Round Rock.

She is preceded in death by her parents, Carl and Alma Bohot, and brother, Rev. Paul Bohot.
