



Clarence Alfred Fischer

June 19, 1951 - August 16, 2016

Funeral services for Clarence Fischer, 65, of Fedor, Texas, are scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, August 18, 2016 at St. John Lutheran Church in Lincoln, Texas with Rev. Dale Bohm officiating. Burial will follow in the church cemetery. Visitation will be held on Wednesday, August 17, 2016 from 7:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m. and on Thursday, August 18, 2016 from 7:00 a.m. until 8:30 a.m. at Phillips and Luckey Funeral Home in Giddings. The family will be present for visitation Wednesday evening from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m.

Clarence Alfred Fischer was born on June 19, 1951 in Giddings, Texas, the son of Erich Gotthilf Fischer and Bertha Alvina (Fichte) Fischer. He was baptized on July 1, 1951 at St. John Lutheran Church in Lincoln, Texas by Rev. H.A. Stroebel and confirmed on April 11, 1965 also at St. John Lutheran Church in Lincoln by Rev. Carl Biar. His confirmation verse was Psalm 128:1, "Blessed is every one who fears the Lord, who walks in His ways". Clarence graduated from Lexington High School in 1969. He had worked as a surveyor for Texas Parks and Wildlife for 4 years and owned and operated Fedor Store for the past 42 years. Clarence also did fence work and served as a Cooperative Observer for the National Weather Service for several years. He was a member of the Fedor Volunteer Fire Department and served as the first Fire Chief. He enjoyed ranching, doing crossword puzzles and word games, reading and gardening. Clarence passed away during the early morning hours of Tuesday, August 16, 2016 at his home in Fedor.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Erich & Bertha Fischer, and an infant brother.

Clarence is survived by his sister, Bernice Fischer of Fedor; two aunts, Eleanor Fischer of Houston and Bernell Teinert of Giddings; one uncle, Herbert Dube of Fedor as well as many cousins and friends.

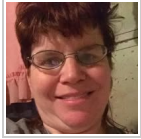
