



## Clint Jolly Roberts

July 3, 1934 - January 31, 2024

Funeral services for Clint Roberts, 89 of Giddings, are scheduled for 2:00 p.m. on Friday, February 2, 2024 at Phillips and Luckey Funeral Home in Giddings with Ron Clark and Brother Jimmy Arnold officiating. Clint Jolly Roberts was promoted to Glory on Wednesday, January 31, 2024, at his home in Giddings, Texas.

Clint was born on July 3, 1934, in Bayside, Texas to Charles Thomas Roberts, Sr. and Carrie Olive (Jolly) Roberts.

After he graduated from Woodsboro High School, he joined the United States Army and was deployed to Korea. Upon his return home he worked a variety of jobs until he joined his brothers in the family business, where they taught him the art of welding. Over the course of his career, he was a pipeline welder; was certified as a welding instructor and passed his vast knowledge of the trade on to numerous students at Bee County College in Beeville, Texas; and worked as a welding inspector and consultant.

Clint married the love of his life, Mallie Marie Minyard – twice, no less! The

first time in the summer of 1960, followed by the births of their daughters, Debbie and Sheri, and again in the spring of 1985.

He enjoyed spending time with his family, serving his community, bowling, playing golf, reading, and working on any number of “projects”. He had a servant’s heart and a kind and generous spirit, supporting multiple causes that he believed in.

Clint was a member of the Giddings Breakfast Lions Club and had a lifetime membership with The International Association of Lions Clubs. He could be found at most service projects sponsored by the club. Over the years he washed a lot of dishes; parked thousands of cars at Friday night football games; coordinated and participated in the building of many wheelchair ramps in the Lee County Area as the Chairman of the Texas Ramp Project; and made great long-time friends. During his time with the Giddings Breakfast Lions Club, he served in many roles, including President. His commitment and service were honored and recognized when he was awarded the Lion of the Year award in 1991-1992 and 2015-2016; the Jack Welch Fellow Award for dedicated service to the children of the Texas Lions Camp; and the Melvin Jones Fellow Award for dedicated humanitarian services through the Lions Club International Foundation. He also was a Texas Lions Camp for Children Century Club Fourth Generation Key Holder and was awarded the Texas Lions Foundation Fellow Award honoring outstanding contribution to the Texas Lions Foundation.

Clint was a member of Narrow Path Christian Ministries where he took great pleasure in serving as a greeter and preparing communion for his church family. On Sunday evenings you’d find him serving food with Mission U2/Feed the Need and sharing God’s love with the community with his amazing smile and kind words.

While he was never known to quote the Bible, his was worn out, and you'd usually find it open on the end table next to his chair. Clint practiced his faith in his day-to-day life. Although he was saved as a young man, he rededicated his life to Christ and was baptized on September 30, 2014, when he was 80 years old. His daughter and granddaughters have been known to refer to him as "the greatest man on earth", and he earned that title by showing integrity, kindness, acceptance, grace, mercy, and love their entire lives.

Clint was welcomed into Heaven by Jesus – St. Peter of course! – his parents; daughter, Sheri Roberts; parents-in-law, Thurman and Bessie Minyard; grandson, Dustin Etzel; wife, Mallie Roberts; 12 brothers and sisters and their spouses; sister-in-law, Wanda Hooker; and dear friend, Cindy Jaeger; along with many loved ones and friends. What a celebration that was!

He leaves behind his daughter and son-in-law, Debbie and Bubba Alexander; grandchildren Carly and Charles Wray, Leslie and Patrick Creppel, Haley Alexander and fiancé Allen Bledsoe, Zach and Ashley Alexander, and Jacob Alexander; great-grandchildren Tristan Wray, Randa Voight and fiancé Jase Flowers, Layton Alexander, Aidan and Brynn Wray, Savannah and Nathan Guevarra, Brooke Creppel, Weston Alexander, and Brynn Alexander; great-great-grandchildren Shiloh Wray and Anavrin Guevarra; sister-in-law, Barbara and Bob Craig; life-long friend, Dan Jaeger and his daughters, Kristi and Stefany, and their families; and numerous nieces, nephews, and friends.
