



Dennis James Boettcher

Funeral services for Dennis James Boettcher, 79, of Lexington, will be held 10:00 am, Wednesday, March 18, 2026 at St. James Lutheran Church in Lexington with Rev. Jonathan Meyer and Rev. Dale Bohm officiating. Burial will follow in the St. James Cemetery in Lexington. Visitation will be held Tuesday, March 17, 2026 from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm and Wednesday, March 18, 2026 from 7:00 am until 8:00 am at Phillips and Luckey Funeral Home in Giddings. The family will be present for visitation on Tuesday from 5:00 pm until 7:00 pm.

Walter Dennis James Boettcher, passed away peacefully Thursday, March 12, 2026. His last memory on this earth was being surrounded by his entire family on a beautiful afternoon watching the cows on his farm. This was part of Dennis and Elaine's evening routine for many years. They loved ending their evening spending time outdoors, and taking in the beauty of the life they built together.

Dennis was born September 14, 1946, to Walter & Ella (Nee Symmank) Boettcher in Rockdale, Texas. Dennis was baptized on September 29, 1946 at St. James Lutheran Church by Pastor H.A. Stroebel. He was confirmed on May 14, 1961, by Pastor Paul Stengel Jr. His confirmation verse was John 8:31-32, (Then said Jesus to those Jews which believed on him, If ye continue in my word, then are ye my disciples indeed; and ye shall know the truth, and

the truth shall make you free.) After graduating Lexington High School in 1966, he went to TSTI in Waco, Tx where he was the first class to graduate with an associate's degree in welding. Dennis married the love of his life, Elaine Becker, at St James Lutheran Church on June 26, 1971. This union was blessed with 3 sons: Craig & wife Elizabeth, David & wife Kellye, Phillip & wife Ashlyn, all of Lexington, Texas.

Dennis was known for his hard work and dedication. From growing and selling watermelons in High School, to starting his own welding business in the early 70's. At Boettcher Welding, he built everything from cattle trailers to repairing farm equipment. Being the businessman Dennis was, he expanded his services to do anything he could to provide for his family. One of his favorite comments was "You've got to be a thinker". With that mentality, he did everything from custom hay baling, putting in septic systems, building metal buildings, and anything else he could do to make an honest dollar. His welding business grew throughout the 80's during the "Oil Boom" in Lee County, eventually growing into what Boettcher Enterprises is today. Although welding was his trade, his passion was working on his 2nd generation farm. He took pride in keeping it well maintained. Some of his happiest moments were spent running equipment and taking care of cattle and farming. Papa made many memories with his children and grandchildren working on the farm. His family and land were his pride and joy. One of his favorite times of the year was the Boettcher Family Reunion at the lake. He also looked forward to Wednesday evening gatherings, playing pool volleyball and storytelling at Walch Store with his dearest friends.

He is preceded in death by his parents Walter and Ella Boettcher; mother and father-in-law, Rubin and Ruth Becker; brothers, Franklin Sr. and wife Lillie Mae, and Ernest Boettcher; sisters, Bernice Markert and husband Carl, Vernita Ruth, Lorine Jatzlau and husband Herman; brothers-in-law, Wilbert Patschke, Larry and Bernie Miertschin, James Becker, Harold Mathena,
