



Dorothy Jean Moore

Funeral services for Dorothy Moore, 79 of McDade, Texas, are scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on Monday, April 6, 2015 at Martin Luther Lutheran Church in Giddings with Rev. Dick Reinap officiating. Burial will follow in the McDade Cemetery. A reception and light lunch will immediately follow the burial at New Hope Lutheran Church in McDade. Visitation will be held on Saturday, April 4, 2015 from 10:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. and on Sunday, April 5, 2015 from 2:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m. at Phillips & Luckey Funeral Home in Giddings. The family will be present for visitation Sunday evening from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m.

Dorothy Jean (Frosch) Moore was born on October 1, 1935 in Lexington, Texas to Clarence Monroe Frosch & Lena Katherine (Marburger) Frosch. She graduated from Lexington High School in 1954 and attended nursing school in Austin. She was united in marriage to George Edward Moore on June 17, 1956 at the Lexington United Methodist Church in Lexington. Dorothy retired from the Giddings State School where she had worked as a houseparent for 25 years. She had been an active member of Faith Lutheran Church and New Hope Lutheran Church in McDade where she had been involved with the Women of the Word and quilted for Lutheran World Relief. She was a charter member of the VFW Post 8313 Ladies Auxiliary in McDade and a member of the Texas Education Extension Agency and the Bastrop County German Club. She was involved with the McDade Watermelon Festival for years and had served as parade marshal. The top priorities in Dorothy's life were her faith

and her family. She enjoyed quilting and made quilts for most of her family. She also earned the title of "Granny Flash" due to her love of taking pictures. She could usually be found working in her garden, taking care of her flowers, taking care of animals or going to garage sales. She was a collector of all things, especially cookbooks, and could fix anything, especially with baling twine.

Dorothy passed away the morning of Thursday, April 2, 2015 at her home in McDade following an extended illness. She left this life the same way she lived it, strong in her faith and with family by her side.

She was preceded in death by her parents, Clarence & Lena Frosch; her husband of 54 years, George Moore Sr.; her daughter-in-law, Belinda Moore and brothers-in-law and sisters-in-law, Ray & Thelma McDavid, Wilbur & Nell Moore and Marie Moore.

I first came to know Dorothy soon after her marriage to George's. She was the Avon lady & would come to sell Avon to the 3 Farris sisters. She & George lived in McDade then, in the little yellow house behind John Moores. Dorothy was going to nursing school until her marriage. Dan related the night George met Dorothy at a dance in Gidding's. It was Dan, George, & Morris Kastner that night, and 2 Frosch sisters, that included sister Vernell. That night Morris was attracted to Vernell. And Dan said he was left out due to there not being another Frosch sister. These two couples ended up marrying. And Dan rocked along until January 1961, when he & I married. Dorothy & I were special friends for years. Her last 3 children were born at the time that I had 3 of my children. Dorothy had a head start on me in having our children, for she already had 3, Junior, David, & Jeannie. Our children grew up together as if they were siblings. My youngest, Julie & Dorothy's youngest, Gary were the only students that received a Social Security check in their Senior Class, for that was how old their fathers were when they graduated. I usually covered most of the occasions in McDade by taking pictures, that was my hobby. Then that became Dorothy's passion, so she became the self designated photographer, covering all the weddings, anniversaries, & etc. I took pictures of her children's weddings, and she did the same for me. We both were real active in our Lutheran Church in any project that may be going on. We were making quilts in 1971, when Wm. Was born, by using nylon stockings & placing them to form square pillows & then the little pillows were all attached to each other. We women worked on making chrismons for our 2 very tall cedar Christmas trees that our church had each year, that took 2 years to make enough for 2 trees. Then after Gary was born, Dorothy began her long career of working the night shift at Gidding's State School. She was such a caring mother, caring & supporting her children in all their school activities such as their many sports teams & band, F F A and etc. Dorothy was an avid quilter, I don't think there was ever a time that she wasn't working on a quilt. She won a lot of honors on her quilts. They were all gifted to each of her children, then she did a quilt for each of her grandchildren, and up to her last year she was working on a baby quilt for her last born great grandchild, and her daughters completed this little quilt for their Mom (she had it almost completed). Dorothy will live on in our minds & heart for ever, she has left behind a legacy for all to remember. She was loved by many. By her friend, Evelyn Wolf

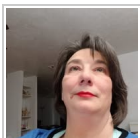

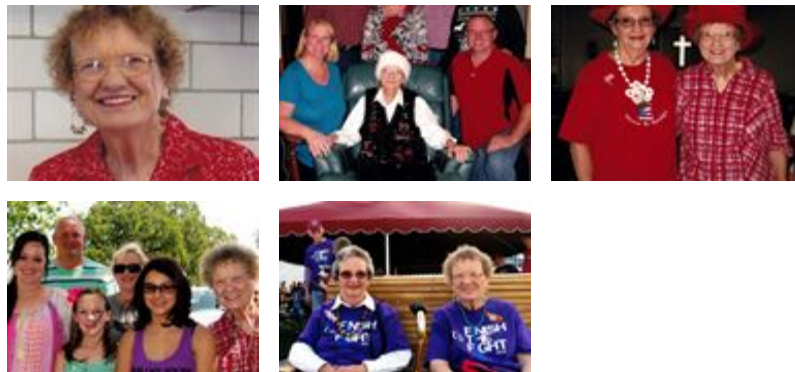
