Frances, lovingly known as "Sissie" passed away after a courageous 16-year battle with Cancer. A public visitation will be held October 2, 2023, from 5:00 to 7:00pm at Phillips and Luckey Funeral Home in Caldwell. Graveside services will be October 3rd, 2023, at 10:00am in the Historic SPJST Cemetery if weather permits. If the weather is bad, services will be in the chapel at Phillips and Luckey Funeral Home, in Caldwell.

Frances E. "Sissie" Giles was born October 11, 1949, to Estelle Lenora Nedbalek Giles and William Jacob Giles, Sr. in Beaumont, Jefferson County, Texas. She was the second child and only daughter. Sissie graduated from Beaumont High School in Beaumont, Texas the class of 1967. She attended the University of Texas School of Nursing and Graduated in 1972 with her BSN degree. She passed her state board exam and became a registered nurse that same year. Sissie loved being a nurse and hesitantly retired after

35 years of service. Towards the end of her nursing career, she worked as a Physic Nurse and as a Triage Nurse.

Sissie had several years of post-graduate hours towards a master's degree. She loved stamp collecting, having pen pals, antique dish collecting and reading books of all kinds. She was inducted as a Daughter of the American Revolution on November 5th, 2018, into Daniel Coleman Chapter, Georgetown, Texas. She has been a member of the Episcopal Church since 1974. Sissie never was married or had children but everyone she met became her family, and every child hers. She loved her dogs and cats and spoiled them like family.

We are grateful for the sure hope of resurrection from the dead through faith in Jesus Christ our Savior and are greatly looking forward to seeing her again in Heaven. She had a true servant's heart and helped so many people during her life. Sissie was gifted in hospitality and listening with her heart to any family or friends that were in need.
