A graveside service to celebrate the homegoing of Helen King, 84 of Lexington, Texas, is scheduled for 4:00 p.m. on Tuesday, July 5, 2022 at Copperas Cemetery in Lexington, Texas. Officiating will be Pastor Richard L. Washington of Goodwill Baptist Church of Dime Box.

On March 14, 1938, Helen Lenora Williams King was born to Evans and Normal (Phenix) Williams in Lexington, Texas. Working as a midwife, Helen sat with many families during difficult times. She helped bring many babies into this world and would help many mothers during the birth of their children. At times you would find her reading to the children at the local daycare. Helen was an extraordinary gardener who created a landscape that got better each year. Her love for gardening could be seen all through town. When parents would drop off or pick up their children from school, they would wave and admire her beautiful garden. Sometimes they would ask what kind of plant she had growing, and she would make a cutting and send it home with them. Helen was a member of the Lexington Garden Club and the Arbor Day Foundation. She was also a passionate animal lover. If she ever saw a plant, animal, child, or person in need of help, she would jump into action. She and her friends would volunteer at the food bank and would deliver food if people were not able to make it, as she would never let anyone go hungry. There were many times she would hook her barbeque pit on the back of her little red truck and by the time she got to her destination the food would be ready to

eat. If Helen had not seen someone in a few days, she would go out of her way to make sure they were ok. She was proud of her work with Luby's Cafeteria. The owner of Luby's would fly her in his private plane to open new locations where she oversaw the success of kitchen openings. Helen took pride in ensuring each kitchen was set with proper appliances and staffing. Helen had many passions in her life, she had a true gift for hairstyling. Helen will be remembered for her love of ice cream, watching westerns, playing dominoes, her hats and glasses, music and dancing. Helen had an infectious personality. She was sassy, funny, loving, and always had a bounce in her step. Helen loved her family, friends, and community.

Helen passed from this life into her eternal home the morning of Tuesday, June 28, 2022 in Giddings.

She leaves to cherish her memories until they meet again, her four grandchildren, Gregory Morris, Michael Morris, Shawntel Wilson, and Tanaka Castro, 16 great grandchildren, 10 great-great grandchildren, and a host of nieces, nephews, cousins, and friends.
