



H.L. "Buzzy" Allert

January 5, 1932 - June 26, 2020

Due to current health restrictions, a family memorial service for H.L. "Buzzy" Allert, 88, of Lexington, Texas, is scheduled for 4:00 p.m. on Sunday, July 5, 2020 at the First Baptist Church in Lexington with Pastor Chris Bruce and Pastor David Smith officiating. The church will be live streaming the service on the First Baptist Church Lexington Facebook page so that all of his friends and family can take part.

Buzzy Allert was born on January 5, 1932 in Gonzales, Texas to James Roswell Allert Sr. and Mittie (Brown) Allert. He married Margaret Alice Hunter on July 7, 1962 in Lake Village, Arkansas. Buzzy received his bachelor's degree from Southwest Texas State University and his master's degree from Prairie View A & M University. While at Southwest Texas State, he was an All-American Football Player and inducted into the Southwest Hall of Honor. He went on to play for the Detroit Lions and Toronto Argonauts. After retiring from professional football, Buzzy entered coaching. He coached in Texas for 30+ years. His final team was at Northbrook High School in Houston. After leaving coaching, he became the assistant athletic director at Spring Branch ISD. He worked with many youth and students over the years and used football to prepare young men for life. Buzzy was a member of First Baptist Church in Lexington and the Southwest Texas Athletic Alumni Association. He enjoyed working in the yard and gardening. Family was very important and Buzzy loved being involved in his grandson's lives.

Buzzy passed away the morning of Friday, June 26, 2020 in Houston, Texas.

He was preceded in death by his parents, James and Mittie Allert; wife, Margaret Allert; grandson, Ty Hunter Allert II; five brothers, James R. Allert Jr., Arthur Allert, Robert Allert, Vernon Allert, and Charles Allert, and three sisters, Betsy Allert, Doris Allert, and Fannie Lee Watts.

Buzzy is survived by his son and daughter-in-law, Ty and Merry Allert of Lexington; three grandsons, Chase & Shannon Allert of Tyler, Aaron Allert of Lexington, and Luke Allert of Lexington; one brother, John Allert of Gonzales, and numerous nieces, nephews, and cousins.
