Died April 17 2016 at VA Community Living Center in Temple

Hugo was born in Burton February 1, 1943 to Eton & Lena (Oevermann) Heins. He attended school in Burton & Carmine. Hugo attended Blinn Jr. College.

Hugo was in law enforcement for 21 years. He served in the Brenham Police department, as the Somerville Police Chief, and in the Burleson County Sheriff's department as Chief Deputy. He then went to work for U.S. Hanger Company, retiring as trucking and warehouse manager.

Hugo joined the Army in 1964. He served in Vietnam one year and was honorably discharged in 1966. He was proud to have served his country. He was a lifetime member of Caldwell VFW Post 4458 in Caldwell, Texas.

Hugo's passion for music began early in his life. His mother gave him his first guitar when he was 14. He was self taught and played his first dance job when he was 15. He played guitar with a Bluegrass band when he was stationed in Virginia. He played rhythm guitar and bass for numerous bands and had his own band until his health forced him to retire after 54 years. He enjoyed playing dominos and listening to music and jamming with his wife and friends.

Hugo was preceded in death by his parents, one sister, Esther Mertz, and three brothers, Clenwood Heins, Louis Heins and Travis Heins.

Survivors include his wife Faye Heins of Somerville, one daughter Dayna Davenport and her husband Rick, and a granddaughter Callie all of College Station. Other survivors are his sister and brother-in-law Perlie and Weldon Klaus of Shelby, beloved niece Connie Strong and her husband Lanny of Chappel Hill, and step-son Sam Langham and his wife Daisy of Snook. Also surviving him is his close friend Albert Garcia of Brenham.
