Jean Carroll Stewart was born on November 17, 1941, in Chicago, Illinois, the daughter of William H. Greenfield and Louise A. Greenfield. She was baptized in the Methodist faith in 1946. After graduating from high school, she graduated from Stephen F. Austin State University with a double major in English and History. At Stephen F. Austin, she met the love of her life Randy Stewart, and they were united in marriage on August 14, 1965, at Highland Park Methodist Church in Dallas, Texas. Together they were blessed with two children, Chris Stewart and Tricia Stewart. While Randy attended University of Texas School of Law, she worked for The Texas State Comptroller and as a homemaker. She loved gardening and creating flower arrangements. She was a member of the Giddings Garden Club, The Violet Crown Garden Club of Austin and a National and Texas State Flower Show Judge. She was an active participant in flower shows and a guest speaker at conventions around the state. She was a collector of Indigenous American artifacts and retro ceramics; however, her consuming pastime was caring for her family and hosting gatherings of friends at her house.

Jean passed away the evening of Friday, May 8, 2026, at her home in Giddings with her family by her side.
