



Jesse "Sugar Boy" Alfred Gandy

May 11, 1934 - March 14, 2021

Memorial services for Jesse "Sugar Boy" Gandy, 86 of Ledbetter, Texas are scheduled for 2:30 p.m. on Saturday, March 20, 2021 at the Ledbetter Fireman's Hall in Ledbetter, Texas with Tim Pitts officiating. Burial will take place at Liberty Community Cemetery near Cameron, Texas at a later date.

Jesse Alfred Gandy was born on May 11, 1934 in Hanover, Texas to James "Jim" Dollar Gandy and Zeta Alpha (Nelson) Gandy. When he was born, he was known as "Sugar Baby" for the six months of his life. His name was changed to "Sugar Boy" until he was in high school and then also went by the name "Champ". Being the youngest of six children, he grew up on the family place in a one room house that had been divided into bedrooms. During the summers they would move the beds outside to sleep under the trees and stars. He grew up around horses and mules and was also taught the trade of making rope and shoeing horses. Jesse graduated from Milano High School in 1952. On June 7, 1953, Jesse and Cleva (Golather) were married at their home in Kingsville, Texas. The Gandy name could be found on several businesses he and his family owned and operated over the years - Gandy Gulf and U-Haul, Gandy Trucking, and Gandy and Sons Inc. He loved going on trail rides, and at the age of 72 spent 48 days and 690 miles going from Bandera, Texas to Dodge City, Kansas. Jesse was a member of the South Texas Trail Riders, Tip-O-Tex Trail Riders, Kleberg County Trail Riders, and was involved in many rides for charity. He and Goldie his horse could be

spotted in many photographs across Texas, and his mule team was pictured in front of the Alamo. Jesse always said he was “world famous” as he always ran into someone he knew from his travels. He was locally known as the “unofficial Sheriff of Ledbetter”.

Jesse passed away the morning of Sunday, March 14, 2021 at his home in Ledbetter.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Jim and Zeta Gandy; one brother, Dr. James Gandy; two sisters, Ella Fay and Johnny Mayfield, and Maxine and Alvin Fail; brother-in-law, Kelly Schmidt, and three nephews, Alvin Fail III, James Dollar Fail, and Bill Gandy.

Jesse is survived by his wife of 67 years, Cleva Gandy of Ledbetter; children, Jim and Nancy Gandy of Ledbetter, Wes and Darla Gandy of Ricardo, and Bob Gandy of Ricardo; six grandchildren, Kacey and John Cantu of Bishop, Cristyn and Cody Pharis of Dime Box, Paige and Tripp Mathews of Boerne, Jess and Cassey Gandy of Ledbetter, Chelsey Gandy of Corpus Christi, and Samantha Gandy of Corpus Christi; five great grandchildren; two sisters, Minnie Schmidt of Mason and Thelma Moody of Kerrville; one sister-in-law, Mickey Gandy of San Antonio, as well as many nieces, nephews, extended family, and friends.

Serving as honorary pallbearers will be Zeta Ruth Fail, Jimmy Mayfield, Jess Gandy, Richard Howard, Claude Kemple, Alvin Fail, Ron Owen, Ray Golather, Donny Haggerton, and Steve Barrett.
