Joseph E. Vollmer, 74, passed away July 21, 2024, at his home in Lexington, Texas after his courageous battle with cancer. He was surrounded by his loved ones who will continue to honor his legacy by living their lives to the fullest.

Joe was born in Houston, Texas on August 15, 1949. At the age of 6, he and his mother, Ellen, moved to Corpus Christi, Texas. Joe attended Ray High School and later enlisted in the Army Reserves. Together, they started their own air conditioning and heating business in 1984 and successfully served the Corpus Christi community for well over three decades. Joe officially retired in 2019, and he and his “bride” (as he lovingly referred to Barb) moved to a beautiful place in the country outside of Lexington, Texas.
