



Kermit William Langehennig

September 13, 1931 - June 27, 2019

Funeral services for Kermit Langehennig, 87, of Lexington, Texas, are scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, July 2, 2019 at the Lexington United Methodist Church in Lexington with Rev. Raegan Seaton officiating. Burial will immediately follow in the Lexington Cemetery. Visitation will be held on Monday, July 1, 2019 from 11:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. at Phillips and Luckey Funeral Home in Lexington. The family will be present for visitation Monday evening from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m.

Kermit William Langehennig was born on September 13, 1931 in Fredericksburg, Texas to Albert and Regina (Thiele) Langehennig. He was baptized on October 25, 1931 by Rev. A. Koerner and confirmed on March 25, 1945 by Rev. Otto Lindenberg at Holy Ghost Lutheran Church in Fredericksburg. His confirmation verse was 1 Thes. 5: 21-22 "Prove all things; hold fast that which is good. Abstain from all appearance of evil." Kermit served in the U. S. Army from January 1, 1951 to January 31, 1954. He married Billie Ann Fricke on June 6, 1954 at the Lexington United Methodist Church and they were blessed with six children. Kermit was a member of Lexington VFW and Alcoa Steel Workers Union. Kermit enjoyed raising his kids, playing the accordion and piano, camping, fishing, hunting, going to watch the Lexington Eagles football games, mowing, gardening, going on vacations, going to family reunions and enjoyed spending time with his family and friends.

Kermit passed away the morning of Thursday, June 27, 2019 in Lexington, Texas.

He was preceded in death by his wife, Billie Ann Langehennig; two sons, Jeffrey Langehennig and Gregory Langehennig; son-in-law, Travis Robertson; parents, Albert and Regina Langehennig, and four brothers, Victor Langehennig, Andrew Langehennig, Walton Langehennig and Oliver Langehennig.
