James Larry Bills, 76 of Caldwell, passed away early Wednesday, August 25, 2021. Visitation will be Friday, August 27, at the Caldwell First United Methodist from 5 to 7 pm in the Fellowship Hall. Funeral services will be on Saturday, August 28, at 10 am at the Phillips & Luckey Funeral Home. Military Honors will be performed at the Caldwell Masonic Cemetery.

James Larry Bills was born in Caldwell, TX on February 10, 1945 to parents Clingman Bills and Mamie (Weber) Bills. Larry went to Caldwell High School and enlisted to the US Coast Guard. Larry got injured during his time in the service and was Honorably Discharged. He stayed very active in Caldwell, patrolling the streets and letting everyone know who passed. Larry enjoyed to collect things and play the scratchers. He was a member of the Caldwell VFW Post #4458 and the American Legion Post #451. He also helped out and was a member of the Disabled American Veterans Post #200 in Bryan, TX.
