



## Lillie Mae Boettcher

September 11, 1931 - April 27, 2025

Lillie Mae Eldine Kaiser was born on September 11, 1931 in Fedor, Texas to Ludwig and Sophie Kaiser. She was baptized on September 27, 1931 by Pastor George Kautz and was confirmed on July 16, 1944 by Pastor H.F. Hollman, both at St. James Lutheran Church, Lexington, Texas. Her confirmation verse was 1 Corinthians 6:20 "For ye are bought with a price: therefore glorify God in your body, and in your spirit, which are God's."

Lillie Mae grew up on a farm in Fedor, Texas. She was an avid reader and could easily solve math problems before receiving instruction. She had dreams of becoming a clothing designer and would sketch her own patterns of the latest fashions.

After returning from the war, Franklin Boettcher, Sr. chose Lillie Mae to join him in marriage and they were united on April 3, 1949. Together they raised seven children, worked cattle, and ran their farm. After thirty short years, the Lord called Franklin to Heaven. She continued to maintain their farm along with their son, Delbert.

Lillie Mae lovingly shared her many gifts with her family, her church, and her community, always offering her time and talents with a gracious heart. She was especially proud of her homemade German noodles, which she enthusiastically prepared for any occasion, from Sunday dinner to family

weddings. She was well known for her delicious coffee cake, a treasured, perfected family recipe. With each passing season, her flowerbeds, garden, and fields yielded harvests of blossoms, fresh vegetables, fruits, and berries, and she delighted in canning, baking, and providing all the fruits of her labor. She even served as a cook in the Lexington School District.

She fulfilled her dream of fashion design by creating stylish clothing for her family, sewing most of her children's outfits and enhancing them with colorful, unique, clever, and practical modifications. Macramé, crochet, needlepoint, cross-stitch, beadwork – she loved crafting gifts with her hands and heart. And she especially loved teaching others.

Family was truly woven into the fabric of her life. She delightedly attended church, family reunions, and celebrations, cherishing every opportunity to visit with loved ones and making new friends. Hosting holiday gatherings in her home brought her great joy. Each summer, the school-aged grandkids would stay with “Grandma” for a week and attend Vacation Bible School. She thoughtfully planned special meals, crafts and activities, and gave them wonderful memories of sun tea, fresh baked cookies, mudpies, tree climbing, fishing, bicycling, hide-n-go seek, and tractor rides with Uncle Bert.

Lillie Mae had a beautiful voice and a heart full of song, which she shared freely and sincerely with those around her. She loved singing from the hymnal in glory to God, gently rocking children to sleep with lullabies, and humming her favorite melodies as she went about her chores. She also found joy in listening, especially when catching up over the phone, and in hearing the sweet songs of her birds that visited her as she relaxed on the porch swing.

With an active, curious, and boundless spirit she daily stayed informed with the latest news, solved word searches and sudoku puzzles, and crocheted up until she was called to join her eternal family. Her laughter and smile,

thoughtful advice, and caring heart will be remembered and missed until we are united with her once more in Heaven.
