



## Louis Edmond Dussetschleger

Louis Edmond Dussetschleger was born on November 10, 1929 in Houston, Texas to Ed & Inez (Bryant) Dussetschleger. He was united in marriage to Betty Ross Alexander on July 14, 1948 in Houston, Texas. While in Houston, he was a store manager for Weigarten Grocery, and then was a painting supervisor with Keystone Valve. He ran Dussetschleger Auto Service from 1979-1988. Before retiring, he worked for Dobos Inc. in Dime Box. Louis served as fire chief for the Lexington Volunteer Fire Department from 1993-2000, and was instrumental in starting the Lexington EMS. He also served as a council member for the City of Lexington from April 1982 until July 1985, serving his last year in office as Mayor Pro Tem. He was a member of the Lexington Church of Christ. Louis hobbies include working at the ranch, working on cars, remodeling houses, and working for his community. He enjoyed spending time with his family and friends.

Louis passed away the evening of Thursday, February 2, 2017 at CHI St. Joseph Health Regional Hospital in Bryan.

Louis is preceded in death by his parents, Ed and Inez; wife, Betty; brother, Bob Dussetschleger, and two sisters, Evelyn Holmes and Darlene Krezer.

He is survived by two sons, Louis "Buster" & Linda Dussetschleger of Lexington, and Darrel & Melody Dussetschleger of Lexington; eight grandchildren; nine great grandchildren, as well as numerous nieces, nephews, cousins and extended family.
