Lynne Langstroth Whited, 91, formerly of Caldwell, a woman of exceptional spirit, grace, and resilience passed away peacefully on July 12, 2023 in Kingwood, Texas. She was born on March 10, 1932, in Needham, Massachusetts to Colonel Guy Langstroth and Edith MacArthur Langstroth, Lynne's life was a testament to the power of perseverance, the importance of family, and the joy of pursuing one's passions.

School District was marked by her dedication to her students and her passion for sports. She coached girls' tennis, basketball and field hockey, instilling in her students the same determination and spirit that defined her own life.

Beyond her professional accomplishments, Lynne was a woman of diverse interests. She was an accomplished bridge player and loved to quilt. Puzzles were a source of joy and relaxation for her. She taught synchronized swimming. She had a special place in her heart for cats and lady bugs, creatures that, like her, were gentle yet resilient.

An adventurous spirit, Lynne learned to fly alongside Billie. Together, they soared above the country, embracing new perspectives and adventures. This spirit also led her to be a Worthy Matron in the Eastern Star in four different states, a testament to her dedication and leadership.

Lynne's legacy lives on in her family. She is survived by her two sons, Wayne and Bruce, three grandchildren, Joshuah, Jessica, and Justin, and five great-grandchildren, Addison, Barrett, Lexi, Mason, and Dylan. Each one carries a piece of Lynne's spirit, her love of life, and her resilience.
