Marvin Leroy Drosche was born on June 7, 1941 in Giddings, Texas to Oscar Paul and Amanda Laura (Jatzlau) Drosche. He was baptized on June 15, 1941 by Rev. Edwin Riske and was confirmed on April 3, 1955 by Rev. Paul Stengel Jr. at St. James Lutheran Church in Lexington.
