



Mildred Knobloch Hines

February 8, 1936 - September 16, 2014

Funeral services for Mildred Hines, 78 of Lincoln, Texas are scheduled for 10:00 a.m. on Tuesday, September 23, 2014 at the Beacon Baptist Church in Bryan, Texas with Pastor Clinton Everitt officiating. A luncheon will be served after the service and graveside services will follow the luncheon in the Vanetia Cemetery. Visitation will be held on Monday, September 22, 2014 from 8:00 a.m. until 9:00 p.m. at Phillips & Luckey Funeral Home in Giddings. The family will be present for visitation Monday evening from 6:00 p.m. until 8:00 p.m.

Mildred Marie (Knobloch) Hines was born on February 8, 1936 in Lincoln, Texas to Walter Rudolph Knobloch and Amalie Margaret (Eschberger) Knobloch. She was baptized and confirmed at St. John Lutheran Church in Lincoln and graduated from Giddings High School in 1954. Following graduation, Mildred went to work at Gulf Envelope Company where she met the love of her life, Dewey Hines. They were married on August 25, 1956 at the First Baptist Church in Giddings. They moved to Jacksonville, Texas where Dewey entered the Jacksonville Baptist College. Dewey's ministry led them to Normangee, Houston, Jasper, Carthage, Bronte, Iola and Roswell, New Mexico. During this time, Mildred worked as a school secretary and was a loving and devoted wife and mother to their son, Edward. After Dewey retired in 1991, they moved back to the Knobloch family farm in Lincoln where she worked as a teacher's aide at Giddings Elementary School. Mildred enjoyed spending time with children and cherished the time she spent with her

grandchildren and great granddaughter. She was a member of the Lee County German Society and would often play dominoes with her friends. Mildred loved being back at the family farm where she could usually be found taking care of her cattle, gardening, sewing and walking the pasture pulling and chopping weeds.

She passed away on Tuesday, September 16, 2014 at Oakland Manor Nursing Center in Giddings following a battle with cancer.

Mildred was preceded in death by her parents, Walter & Amalie Knobloch; her husband of 43 years, Dewey Hines; her brother, Rudolph Knobloch and a sister-in-law, Orabell Knobloch.

She is survived by her son and daughter-in-law, Edward "Eddie" and Marsha Hines of Brenham; three grandchildren, Chance Hines & his fiancée, Laura Duval of California, Braxton Hines & his wife, Akasha of Melissa and Kelsey Kubin & her husband, Kolton of Bryan; her great granddaughter, Rylan Hines of Melissa; her brother, Herman Knobloch of Lincoln and several nieces and nephews.
