Milton Mynar, 83, of Caldwell passed away on Wednesday, October 19th surrounded by his family. Milton was employed for 48 years serving as a parts man for the Chevrolet dealership in Caldwell. Even through the multiple ownerships of the company, he remained

a dedicated and loyal employee. He retired from Caldwell Country Chevrolet January 31, 2012. Milton was happy to serve the people of Caldwell and never met a stranger. He shared his expertise of all vehicles made by Chevrolet to every customer who came through the doors. Everyone who knew Milton knew he was an avid Caldwell Hornet football fan and a fan of all sports. In his younger years, he never missed a Friday night football game with the guys and Friday night football took on a special meaning when he watched his two grandsons take the field as Caldwell Hornets. 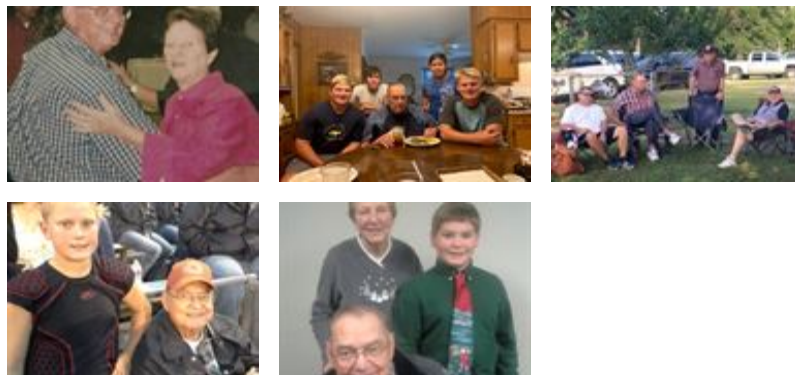
