



Noel Oscar Owers

October 1, 1926 - November 26, 2024

Noel Oscar Norman Owers transitioned into Eternity with God's mighty Angels on Tuesday, November 26, 2024, in Rockdale, Texas. He was 98. Born under the British Empire in Nagpur, India, to Olivia Margarite Owers and Harold Oscar Norman Owers, he was the youngest of three children. Sisters Charlotte Feegrade and Rita Bullard preceded Noel in death. Noel leaves behind his wife of 64 years, Elizabeth Mary "Betty" Owers, his children: Charles Owers of Commerce City, CO; Beverly Cummings of Rockdale; Patrick Owers of Bulverde, TX, and Bridget Market of Tucson, AZ. He is survived by five grandchildren: Daniel and William Cummings; Christian, Annabelle and Samantha Owers; and many relatives in Canada, Australia, England, South Africa and India.

Noel grew up in central India and received his Ph.D. from the Nagpur University of Science (now The Institute of Science) in Nagpur. After graduating, he researched and taught biology until he was recruited by the Bishop of Pennsylvania, on behalf of Duquesne University, to teach in the United States. The curriculum included physics, zoology, biology, biochemistry and chemistry designed for the flood of veterans enrolled using the G.I. Bill. He accepted the position temporarily, intending to return to India. After repeated promotions and requests to stay on, one thing led to another, and he never went back. Instead, he accepted a Post Doctorate Fellowship at Duquesne University. He sent the earnings to relocate family to England and Canada as a result of India's independence from Britain. Betty and her family

landed in England, where Noel married her in 1960. But the newlyweds could not be together in the US for a few more years until Betty was granted a Green Card. By the time she arrived to begin their new life together, Noel was teaching at the University of Wisconsin, in Madison. There, he taught and conducted research. In 1963 he accepted a position at the College of Medicine, University of Iowa. Noel moved his family to Coralville, Iowa, where they lived until 1969.

The family relocated to Richmond, Virginia, for Noel's position in the Department of Anatomy at the Medical College of Virginia. They arrived in Richmond on the day of the Apollo 11 Moon Landing.

He loved spending time with his pre-med and nursing students and was overjoyed to reunite with doctors who'd been his students. He retired from MCV in 1997 as Emeritus Professor of Anatomy.

His astounding musical career began as a self-taught boy. As a teenager he joined the "Rhythm Boys" in the early 1950s. Eventually, Betty would sing while Noel played the piano and for the next 63 years they performed at every opportunity from one side of the ocean to the other as long as there was a piano in the room. After retirement, he played the organ for the choir at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in south Richmond; and joined the Knights of Columbus. They were parishioners at Sacred Heart for 50 years. For fun, he and Betty performed in retirement homes and at events, mostly playing and singing songs of the '40s and '50s such as Nat King Cole's "Stardust" and "Smoke gets in Your Eyes" by the Platters. He loved Glenn Miller and his Orchestra and played "In the Mood" at every party. As an American patriot he played any patriotic song at the drop of a hat.

Noel was a man of high principles and few words, a voracious reader, an excellent writer and orator. He loved marzipan and cream puffs and a good cup of Indian black tea. He was a true gentleman from the top of his head to the tips of his toes. His impeccable manners and dress never changed, and he never failed to show compassion to all who he met.

As a faithful servant to Christ and life-long Catholic, Noel's devotion to God

was reflected by his immense gentleness, patience, kindness and generosity. He was slow to anger at all times and forgave everyone. His conviction to live by the teachings of King Jesus Christ secures him a place in the Kingdom of Heaven, most likely sitting at an organ or piano.

Interment will be in the Archdiocese of San Antonio - Holy Cross Catholic Cemetery, San Antonio, Texas, on December 10, 2024
