



Robert Monroe Clements

May 16, 1925 - May 7, 2023

Robert Monroe Clements was born on May 16th, 1925 in Cameron, Texas to Bob Wallace Clements and Florence Kolba Clements. He Died on May 7th 2023 in Tomball Texas, only nine days from his ninety-eighth birthday. Robert is survived by his son Michael Douglas Clements and his son Brett Wallace Clements and his wife Rikke Clements, and grandchildren Joshua Clements and Chloe Croft, all of Tomball Texas. Robert is also survived by his sister Ann Terry and her Husband Roger Terry and Their Sons Mark, Stephen, and David Terry. Robert is also survived by many nieces and nephews.

Robert was preceded in death by his loving wife of 70 years, Billie Jean (Landis) Clements of Rockdale, Texas. Robert and Billie were married on June 15th 1943 in Cameron Texas. Robert was drafted into the Signal Corp shortly after they married in 1943 until the end of WWII. After Robert was discharged from the military, Robert and Billie resided in San Antonio where their first Son Michael Douglas Clements was born on July 18, 1948. They relocated to Houston Texas in 1949 when Robert started working for International Harvester in Houston. Robert attended night school at University of Houston under the GI Bill after working days in the accounting department at IH. On May 13th 1958 their second son, Brett Wallace Clements was born. Robert worked for International Harvester for 40 years and retired in 1990 at sixty- five.

Billie Jean suffered twelve years with the decline of Dementia until she fell asleep in Christ in 2014. Robert cared for his loving wife with tenderness and

patience until her rest. Robert would be quick to declare that his most important blessing in life was his calling through the Truth of the Gospel, to become a servant of the Living God and his Son Jesus Christ. He was baptized into the saving name of Jesus Christ on June 3rd 1968 and was a faithful member of the Christadelphian Community for Fifty-Five years. Robert believed that apart from the hope that God revealed through his people Israel, that men are without hope and without God in the world. He believed it is only through the resurrection of God's Son Jesus Christ, that men can also take on the hope of life again from the sleep of death by being baptized and living a life serving Christ. To be Christ-like in words and deeds is not easy. But Robert believed it was required to be called a servant of Christ. Robert continued to pray and watch for the return of his Master, for Jesus proclaimed he would return in the same way he left to judge the quick and the dead. Robert received strength in the vision of the return of Christ and the establishment of his Kingdom on Earth. Robert now is at rest in the hope of Israel awaiting the Master's call to COME FORTH!
