Robert and I immediately became best friends as he welcomed me into the neighborhood. I have countless memories of our shared youth, from playing neighborhood baseball and playing on the same little league team coached by my father. We explored the nearby woods, shot BB guns, and had fun blowing up ant beds with firecrackers. We rode bicycles and later each had small motorcycles to ride through our suburban neighborhood. I remember how much trouble we once got in when we accidentally caught a vacant lot on fire and the volunteer fire department was called to put it out. I remember Saturday morning pancake breakfasts with his family, back yard hamburgers, joining him as he raced go cart and then helping him repair them for the next week of racing. If it had a motor, Robert could fix it, and it had wheels, Robert could drive it. He was a high school athlete, and loved his Texas Rangers baseball. Our families even vacationed together, pulling camping trailers to Colorado.

After high school, his adventurous spirt took him to the north slope of Alaska to work on the pipeline.

The good times we had together growing up I will always remember. Robert was a dear and loyal friend, with a huge heart, and always cared for others. If you ever were once his friend, you would always be his friend. I will miss you ole' friend.
