



Thelma Ruth Schatte

December 7, 1928 - January 25, 2019

Funeral services for Thelma Schatte, 90, of Giddings, Texas are scheduled for 2:00 p.m. on Tuesday, January 29, 2019 at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Giddings with Rev. Robert Tiner officiating. Burial will follow in the Giddings City Cemetery. Visitation will be held on Monday, January 28, 2019 from 10:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m. and on Tuesday, January 29, 2019 from 7:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m. at Phillips and Luckey Funeral Home in Giddings. The family will be present for visitation Monday evening from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m.

Thelma Ruth Zoch Schatte was born December 7, 1928, in Northrup, Texas. She was the eighth of eleven children born to Gotthilf Martin Zoch and Clara Alfrieda Boettcher. She was baptized on December 16, 1928 by Rev. Herman Schmidt at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Serbin and confirmed on March 29, 1942 at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Giddings by Rev. Max Studtmann. Her confirmation verse was Luke 10:42: "But one thing is needful; and Mary hath chosen that good part, which shall not be taken away from her." KJV

Thelma was raised on the 132-acre Zoch family farm at Northrup and from first to third grade walked to school at St. Paul's Lutheran School in Serbin. She attended grades four through seven at Immanuel Lutheran School in Giddings, Texas. As a child, Thelma worked with her family as they raised corn and cotton, hogs and cattle; she also picked cotton in many of the neighboring farmers' fields to earn money to help support the family. Thelma

moved to Houston at age 14 to work in a diner as a waitress for a short time; she then became governess for a family in River Oaks, Houston where she worked until the age of 18.

Thelma met Louis Schatte at a wedding in the Serbin area and on September 21, 1947, at the age of 18, Thelma married Louis at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Giddings in a wedding ceremony officiated by Reverend Max Studtmann. Their home was the J.C. Schatte family farm 4 miles south of Giddings where Thelma lived for 69 years, working with Louis to raise their family of nine children and many crops including corn, maize, sugar cane, cotton and peanuts. In later years, they converted the farmland to Coastal Bermuda meadows raising over 200 head of Charolais and Black Angus cattle. For some years, Louis and Thelma also owned a Coastal Bermuda planting business and planted many large fields in Lee County.

Thelma loved to cook and bake for her family. Many of her dishes are treasured family memories, especially her homemade bread and made-from-scratch chocolate cakes. She was schooled by her mother in baking quark and cinnamon apple kaffe kuchen, which along with her Swedish Tea Ring were favorites not only of her children but of many nieces and nephews who often came to the farm to visit.

Thelma loved gardening and working in her yard with flowers. At one point she had over 50 rose bushes, with pink roses being her favorite. She worked a very large garden and orchard where she raised many vegetables and fruit trees and canned hundreds of jars of pickles, beans, beets, peaches and pears every year. Her family recalls that she was extremely disappointed if she did not achieve her goal of 200 quarts of pickles each season.

Thelma and Louis were members of Immanuel Lutheran and sang in the choir for many years. This was a great joy for Thelma as singing was one of her

passions. She was often heard singing in her home as she prepared meals, played with and schooled her children and worked in her garden and her fields. The sound of her voice raised in a joyful noise to her Lord and Savior still echoes strongly in her children's hearts and minds and she is remembered for elbow nudges down the pew to her children to remind them to sing in church.

Thelma went into the arms of the Lord on January 25, 2019. She was preceded in death by her beloved son Ronald Wayne Schatte and her husband Louis Theodore Schatte, sons-in-law Randy Zammit and Joseph Hurt, grandson-in-law Justin Evans, her parents, Gotthilf and Clara Boettcher Zoch, her parents-in-law Johann Christoph (J.C.) and Louise Umlang Schatte, her sister Alma Lehmann and brothers, Robert, Walter, Rudie, Edwin, Ludwig and Otto Zoch.

She is survived by her sister Ruth Walther of Missouri City, her brother Paul Zoch of Houston and her brother Monroe Zoch of Austin.

She is also survived by eight children and their families who remain to mourn her passing:

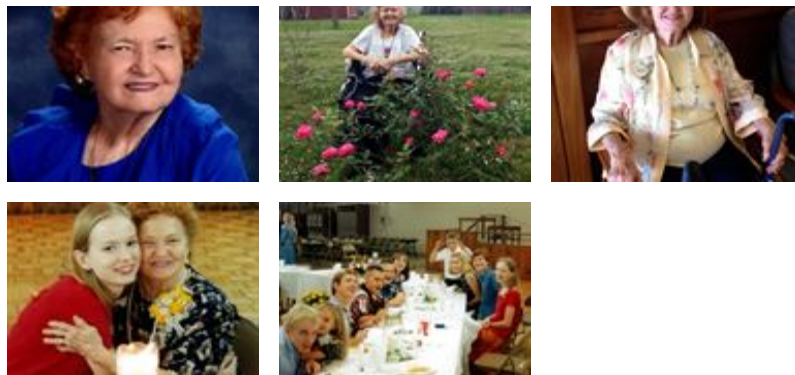

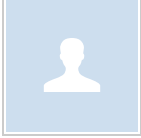

“*Thelma never had good health or material wealth in her life. She really had only three major interests; her faith, her family and her friends.*

Thelma never met a stranger. She always showed a sincere interest and affection for everyone she met, and was instantly liked in return. She was blessed with many good friends, and she enjoyed their visits to her home, especially in her final years when she lost her mobility and vision.

Thelma's greatest love was her nine children. She was so proud of them and loved to show them off. She took great pains to ensure that they always looked nice for church. She worried about them whenever they were beset by difficulties, even when they became adults. Even as some of us began to enter our senior years. It was useless to point out that her children were adults and should be able to handle their own problems; she was a fixer, and she would always try to "fix" things. This carried over to her grandchildren and great-grandchildren. She doted on them, taught them, fretted over their health or grades. She read bedtime stories. She was the world's greatest cook, mother, and grandmother.

Thelma's Lutheran faith was unshakable. Through the bad times (of which there were many) she never wavered. Even the tragic loss of her son, Ronnie, could not cause her to lose her faith in her Lord and Savior. She firmly believed in her Savior, Jesus Christ; In the promise of Heaven; and in the hope of the resurrection. She stated to me, her son Tom, as we drove to the doctor's office on Wednesday that she was weary and it was her wish to depart this life and to go to heaven.

Thelma had been admitted to the hospital on Thursday morning in a semi-conscious state, profoundly weak and unable to talk except for a few times and only in the faintest of whispers. She was however, oftentimes conscious and continued to communicate with her family through nods, shakes of the head, and even smiles. When David

asked her if she would like us to be quiet so she could rest, she vigorously shook her head, "no." When her granddaughter Laura told her stories about her own visits to the farm, she broke into the broadest of smiles.

Suzanna, Romaine and Laura were witnesses to her final words, whispered three times and mouthed a fourth time; "I love you all so much."

Thelma passed away quietly on the evening of Friday, January 25th. She had been surrounded by family constantly for 36 hours. At about 7:20, the nurses asked us to clear the room so they could perform some procedures. When we returned ten minutes later, we found that she had slipped away to the arms of Jesus.
