



## Wanda "Pancake" Wynell Wagner

Wanda served briefly in the U.S. Army and received the rank of Private before receiving her Honorable Discharge on November 9, 1943. Wanda was united in marriage to Louis Edwin Wagner on April 18, 1947 at Immanuel Lutheran Church in Houston. Wanda was a longtime Real Estate Broker in the Houston area and worked with several real estate agencies and earned many industry awards. She also enjoyed tutoring children and helping them to learn to read. While in Houston, she was an active member of Our Savior Lutheran Church where she was a member of the Lydia's Guild and enjoyed attending bible study. After moving to Giddings, the Wagner's joined Immanuel Lutheran Church. Wanda enjoyed sewing and was an excellent seamstress and made much of her own clothing.
