



## Willie J. Boehme

September 24, 1921 - February 27, 2015

Willie John Boehme, 93 of Caldwell passed away peacefully in Bryan, Texas. Services will be held Wednesday, March 4, 2015 at 10:00 a.m. at the Phillips & Luckey Chapel with Pastor David Johnson officiating. Military Honors provided by the Honor detail from Fort Hood. The burial will follow in Caldwell Masonic Cemetery. The visitation will be Tuesday, evening from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m

Willie was born September 24, 1921 in the community of Porter's Chapel in Burleson County, to Fritz M. and Millie (Matejcek) Boehme. Willie was a farm hand when he joined the United States Army in 1942. He was a Cooks Helper but was a participant in the European-African-Middle Eastern Campaign and was awarded the EAME Campaign Medal with 6 Bronze Stars which encompassed these battles: Sicilian, Normandy, Northern France, Ardennes, Rhineland and Central Europe. Upon his return home he married Ira Nadine Hruska January 20, 1946 in Caldwell, Texas. To this union was born two sons, Billy Ray and Kenneth James. The family moved to Houston and Willie went to work for Weingarten Warehouse as a clerk. He was employed there for 38 years. Upon retirement they moved back to Burleson County. Willie belonged to the VFW and enjoyed hunting and fishing, and gardening. He also raised goats and cows and loved being outdoors. He and his wife Ira enjoyed watching Wheel of Fortune together.

He was preceded in death by his wife Ira, his parents, one brother Albert

'Sonny' Boehme, three sisters Alma Valigura, Ella Mae Evans, and Emily Schuhmann.

Willie is survived by his two sons, Billy Ray Boehme and his wife Paula of Dalworthington Gardens, Texas and Kenneth James Boehme and his wife Vivian of Spicewood, Texas. One granddaughter Brigette Nichole Price.
